Responsible Pet Ownership



Responsible Pet Ownership

Responsible pet ownership means taking good care of your pet's needs. It's about making sure they have a safe place to live, the right food to eat, and visiting the vet for check-ups. It also means giving them quality playtime and teaching them how to behave around other animals and people.

Responsible pet owners need to register your pet and keeping them safely confined and safe, such as on a leash or contained to your property.

It's important to remember that having a pet is a big job and you need to be ready to take care of them for their whole life. When you do all these things, you and your pet will be happy together.

Registration

Dogs and cats over three months of age must be registered with your local council. This is a Victorian Government requirement under the *Domestic Animal Act 1994*. Registering at a young age ensures that lost puppies and kittens can be returned to their owners quickly.

Please refer to whittlesea.vic.gov.au/petregistration for a list of our registration fees. Please note that we are unable to register cats unless they are desexed (some exemptions apply).

Microchipping

The Victorian Government requires all newly registered cats and dogs to be permanently identified through a microchip implant. Council is unable to accept any **new** registrations without proof of microchipping, this also includes animals transferring in from other Councils.

Dog Obedience Training

We would strongly encourage all owners to have some level of obedience training to effectively have control over their dog (especially at off-lead parks). Multiple numbers of dogs or cats

If you want to have three or more cats or dogs on your property you must apply for an Excess Animal Permit before you take ownership of the third pet. Please contact Council's Animal Management team or visit whittlesea.vic.gov.au for more information.

Dog poo

Cleaning up after your dog is the law. When out walking your dog, please take the necessary items, such as poo bags, and pick up your pooch's poo.

Off-leash parks

The City of Whittlesea has ten off-leash parks throughout the City of Whittlesea and there are plans to introduce more. Some parks include agility equipment and are designed to give dogs great physical exercise.

- Take dog poo bags to clean up after your dog/s.
- Ensure you supervise your dog at all times and can recall your dog on command
- Please be aware that you are responsible for the actions of your dog.

The City of Whittlesea is an on-lead municipality. You must keep your dog **on its lead** in public areas, unless it's a designated off-leash park.
